Auditor General – Halifax Regional Municipality – Management of Development Approvals Audit Report Released July 18, 2018

Management of Halifax Regional Municipality's development approval processes needs significant improvement, Evangeline Colman-Sadd said in her report released today, July 18th.

The audit found planning application review processes are inefficient and lack consistency among planning staff, contributing to lengthy delays. There is a lack of guidance on which parties should review planning applications, poor communication with developers, and no clear deadlines. Additionally, application review files were sometimes incomplete. "HRM needs to develop a planning application procedure manual to promote efficiency and consistency in reviews," the auditor general said.

Planning and Development's file management system also needs improvement. "There are data quality issues, such as errors and blank fields, that should be addressed to provide management with better information to make decisions," Colman-Sadd said.

Key strategic initiatives, such as simplifying the planning regulatory framework, are behind schedule. "There are 21 municipal plan areas within HRM with separate land use bylaws and municipal planning strategies. Requirements can be quite different for areas next to each other."

Inefficient processes and different approaches among staff lead to lengthy delays. A procedure manual is needed to promote efficiency and consistency in application reviews. Planning and Development's file management system also needs improvement to provide better information to make decisions.

There are delays in implementing Planning and Development's strategic plan which is meant to improve its operations.
